    - learner with special education needs, the Head of Department and principal must take into account the rights and wishes of the parents of such learner: SASA Section 5 (6)

- If the school principal example, if your child needs wheelchair access, and the school does not cater for this, then they could deny access. In this case the governing body could adjust the school's budget to make accomodations for the work required to add wheelchair access.
